

A look at major Trammell Crow projects

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Here's a look at some major projects tied to real estate developer Trammell Crow, who died Wednesday at age 94:

- Embarcadero Center in San Francisco, developed in 1971, a 4.852 million square foot office and retail complex, includes two Hyatt hotels.
- Brussels International Trade Mart in Belgium, established in 1973; more than 1 million square foot wholesale marketplace, home to more than 700 showrooms for fashion and interior design professionals in leather goods, shoes, gifts, furniture, clothing and home textiles (includes The Trade Mart and The Buro & Design Center).
- Peachtree Center in Atlanta, since 1965, mixed use office/retail/mall
- Dallas Market Center, founded in 1957; more than 5 million square feet; four buildings (Trade

Mart, World Trade Center, International Floral and Gift Center, Market Hall), one of the world's largest wholesale merchandise marts, showcasing apparel, gifts, home and garden furnishings, lighting, and floral and gourmet products

— Anatole Hotel in Dallas (now Hilton Anatole), developed in 1978; then a 900-guest room hotel considered a "village within a city." A 1984 expansion made it one of the biggest convention hotels in the Southwest.

— Trammell Crow Center in Dallas, completed in 1984, 1.1 million square feet office building, skyscraper, company headquarters.

— Market Square in Washington, D.C., construction began in 1987, completed in 1990; 1.3 million square-feet, office building.

— 2000 Avenue of the Stars in Los Angeles, developed in 2006; 775,000 square feet, mixed use property, office/retail/restairamts.

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
