- Originally built for the Department of Interior, this building now houses the General Services Administration, the owner and manager of all Federal buildings throughout the country.
- Originally 7 floors, an 8th floor was added in 1935.
- In 1936, the Interior Department moved to the new Department of the Interior Building located directly to the south. The two buildings are connected by a tunnel running under Rawling Park and E Street NW.

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- It stands on a sloping site, rising 86 feet above F Street NW and 103 feet above E Street NW.
- It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1986.
